## Topics and Questions for Discussion

- 3. What is the purpose of the references to doors and how they are used throughout the story?

- 6. What does Main Street symbolizes?
- 7. Who are Authorians and Kafkaists? Which individuals in our modern society would be good examples of each group?
- 8. Would you consider "My Author is Dead" to be a satire? What would be the targets of this satire?
- 9. The novel's byline (on the novel's webpage) is "Not your Usual Dystopia". How is that so?
- 10. Some have said that "My Author is Dead" pushes the boundaries of metafiction. What is metafiction?
- 11. What is Barbooyee saying (if you translate)? Really saying.
- 12. What could be the implication of the last sentences said by Adam at the end of the novel?
